

Den Chief

- The Den Chief works with a den of Cub Scouts and with their adult leaders. He takes part in den meetings, encourages Cub Scout advancement, and is a role model for younger boys. Serving as Den Chief can be a great first leadership experience for a Scout.
- The Den Chief works with the Cub Scouts, Webelos Scouts, and den leaders in the Cub Scout pack. He helps Cub Scouts advance through Cub Scout ranks and encourages Cub Scouts to join a Boy Scout troop upon graduation. Serving as Den Chief can apply towards Positions of Responsibility requirements for Eagle in a Boy Scout Troop or a Varsity Scout Team.
- The Den Chief is appointed by the Senior Patrol Leader.

As Den Chief, I will promote Boy Scouting to Cub Scouts:

- Attend at least 75% of Den meetings of the assigned Den
- Help the Den leader in teaching skills and managing the Den
- Assist Cub Scouts in earning their Webelos and Arrow of Light badges
- Encourage Cub Scouts to continue on to Boy Scouts
- Submit a report to ASPL or Scoutmaster from the Den Leader about my accomplishments
- Wear my uniform correctly, set a good example, practice the Scout Oath and Law
- Fulfill the requirements of this position for 6 months
