Items Provided at Each Campsite

- Latrine with washstand and supplies
- Water spigot
- Bear proof storage box
- Bulletin board
- Fire-fighting equipment
- Flag pole

- Meat thermometer
- Dining fly for each patrol
- Picnic table for each patrol
- Patrol box for each patrol
- Fire pit or burn barrel for each patrol
- 3 dishwashing tubs for each patrol

Each campsite has at least three patrol sites. Trailer parking is available at or near each site. Visit the Sabattis website for more details and pictures of each site.

Campsite Check In Items

At check-in, you will be given a fire extinguisher, meat thermometer and key to your bear box. Please note, you will be expected to return these items at check out. If the fire extinguisher is discharged, meat thermometer broken or lost or bear box key is lost or broken, you will be charged the designated fee associated with these items. In addition, units will be asked pay for the cost to repair or replace other damaged camp equipment including dining flies.

We ask that unit leaders help us keep the conditions of the camp as best as possible and treat the camp facilities and equipment like you would treat your own.
